

Connecting, Strengthening and Scaling Food Supply Chains in the Northwest and Rocky Mountain Region

The Northwest and Rocky Mountain USDA Regional Food Business Center is working in Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, and Wyoming to support and grow farm, ranch and food businesses, as well as broader food supply chain enterprises. Center activities include:

- Developing, delivering and evaluating technical assistance programs, curricula and oneon-one business support;
- Building capacity through direct investments via grantmaking in projects, as well as professional development for regional food system leaders and innovators; and
- Serving as a state/regional hub for federal grants and programs and coordinating partnerships across diverse organizations and regional initiatives.

Priorities for small and mid-sized farm and food businesses participating in local and regional food sectors:

- Supporting animal protein supply chains that respond more nimbly to changes in demand or supply
- Assisting food entrepreneurs in successfully entering local, regional or national markets
- Expanding and diversifying markets for climate resilient agricultural products
- Supporting right-sized, appropriately targeted investment in food value chain infrastructure to enhance business success and long-term viability
