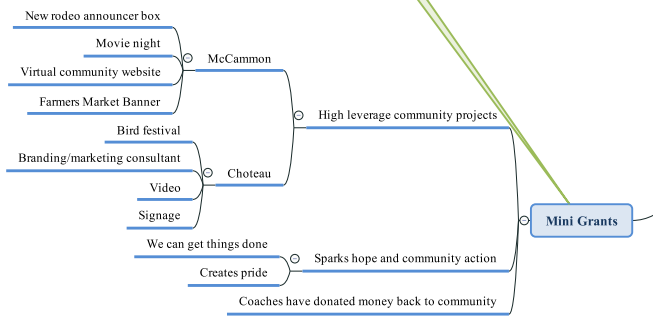
By the time we had that last meeting, there was people who'd come and were very vocal opponents of things going on at the flip chart and they were writing things down. They were leading the discussion among the other people.



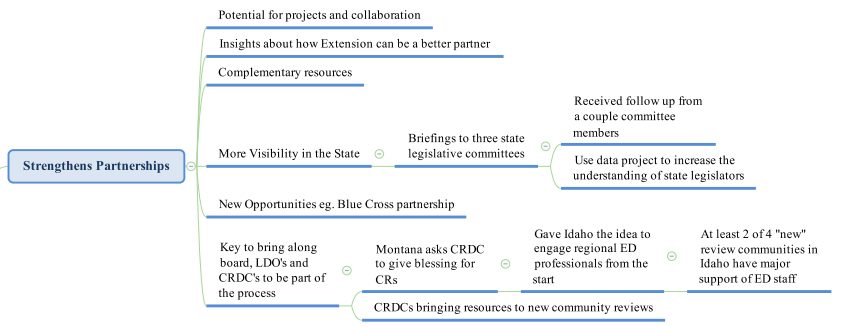
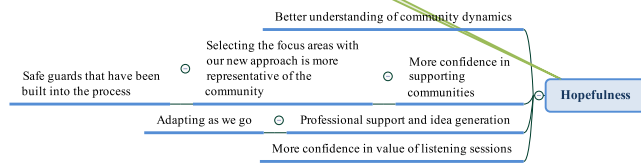
"In my other work I have found myself thinking about how to link the hoped for learning outcomes to the process so that the learners or people I'm working with have opportunities beyond passive information absorption."



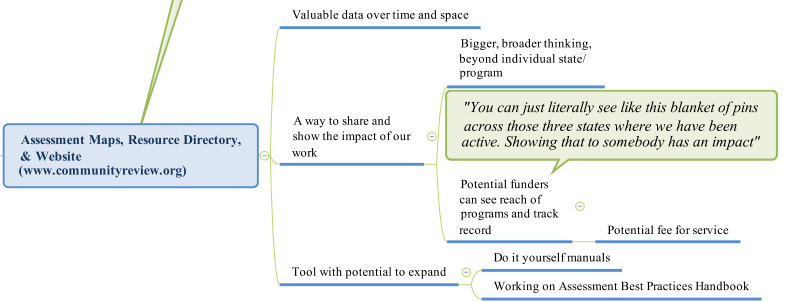

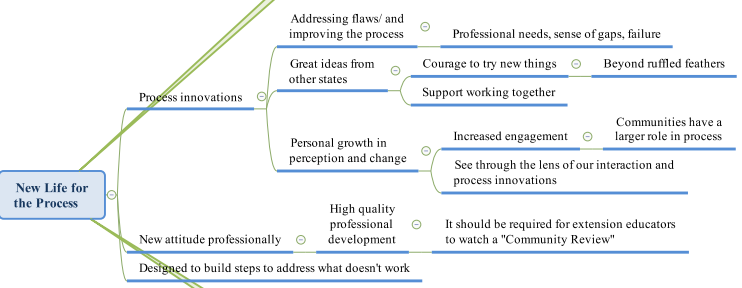
